2015 Global Changes:

We have moved to a Regional Model where we will have **7 regions** and **all countries within the region** will compete on the same dates and times. Each region will hold 3 levels of competitions: CCNA CCENT IT Essentials

NetRiders Changes for 2015

- 1. There will be a regional CCNA, CCENT and IT Essentials competition (students choose one based on eligible courses currently taking or recently completed).
- 2. CCNA will be 3 rounds, CCENT and IT Essentials will be 2 rounds.
- 3. Rounds 1 and 2 are not proctored, so not dependent on school calendars.
- 4. Competitors login at a specific date and time (4 hour block).
- 5. Competitions will be held in English, French and Russian for all levels plus Italian and Polish at the IT Essentials level.
- 6. Beginning with 2015, students may only compete once at each level.

What does this mean for Europe, Russian Federation and CIS?

- No more individual country competitions. All countries compete on the same dates and times. Opportunities for three levels of students (students may compete in one competition only each year).
- 2. Structure of round 3 CCNA is different. After 16 February, the FAQ will be posted with details.
- 3. Students can take the exams anywhere as long as they login during the 4 5 hour window.
- 4. Each level will login on a different day of the same week. Our staff will be available via email.
- 5. French is added. The other languages were available in 2014.
- 6. Students need to be strategic on which year is the best one for them to compete based on courses completed and all other eligibility requirements.

IT Essentials

- Content is **IT Essentials course** skills, soft skills, and loE
- Students must be currently enrolled • in an IT Essentials course or have completed IT Essentials with a course end date in the past 10 months (from the date Registration opens)

Eligible courses

IT Essentials

Competitors who meet course eligibility for two or all three competitions must only select one (CCNA, CCENT or IT Essentials) to compete in. If students have completed CCNA 3 and 4, they must compete in CCNA. CCENT is not an option for them. Beginning with 2015, Competitors are eligible to compete in CCNA, CCENT and IT Essentials one time so be strategic on which year is best.

Competition Model (CCNA, CCENT, and IT Essentials)RegistrationRound 2Round 3

- Open 6 weeks
- Practice Site open

Round 1

- Competitors not proctored, compete during a single 4-5 hour date/time window (Each level a different day of the same week)
- Exams (Technical, IoE & Career Skills)
 - CCNA: 60 minute, 90 question theoretical exam and 60 minute, 15 question PT exam
 - **CCENT:** 60 minute, 80 question theoretical exam and 30 minute, 10 question PT exam
 - IT ESSENTIALS: 60 minute, 60 question exam
- At each level, top 5 scores (minimum 60% score) per academy advance to Round 2

 Competitors not proctored but only compete during a 3-4 hour window date/time (similar to Round 1)

• Exams (Technical, IoE & Career Skills)

CCNA: 60 minute, 100 question theoretical exam and 90 minute, 20 question PT exam

CCENT: 60 minute, 100 question theoretical exam and 60 minute, 20 question PT exam

IT ESSENTIALS: 60 minute, 75 question theoretical exam and 30 minute, 10 question PT exam

- For CCENT, top 5 scores receive a CCNA certification voucher
- For IT Essentials, top 5 scores receive a CompTIA A+ certification voucher (tentative)
- Top 20 per region (minimum 70% score) in CCNA only advance to Round 3 (for Trip Prize)

- Technical Skills Exam (60 minutes, 100 questions)
- TAC Technical Assistance Call Questions (5 minutes per person)

They are given the rules, a Packet Tracer file and the scoring rubric one day ahead of time

They will call into a WebEx session and must be on video before a panel of judges

The judges will ask 3 technical questions based on the Packet Tracer file

Demonstrates technical skills, troubleshooting and soft skills

Scoring rubric with both objective and subjective scoring

Objective on Technical: specific things they ask for or answer, solve issue

Subjective on Soft Skills: friendliness, confidence, speech, etc

Top 2 win Study Trip and top 5 select between CCNA or CCNA Security certification voucher
